The ARGUS SIC Gateway Program

REQUIREMENTS

SIC Gateway Requirements (All Applicants): Must meet one of the three approved training gateways listed below. In addition, ALL SIC applicants must undergo full-motion flight simulator training for the aircraft to be qualified in.

Ab Initio Programs: The ARGUS SIC Gateway Program will consider approving graduates of established Ab Initio programs that meet the following criteria:

- Syllabus must be presented to ARGUS for approval
- Training program must be Competency Based (see Position Paper, Pilot Training and Competency, Flight Safety Foundation, March 2018 and BARS Implementation Guidelines V6, Competency Based Training, Flight Safety Foundation)
- Training time in a simulator must be Level C or higher

For turbojet powered aircraft, Full Motion Simulator training and an appropriate SIC type rating in the aircraft they will fly will be required. Candidate must also meet the hourly requirements of FAR 135.4 (500 hours total time).

- An approved example would be CAE's Transition to Transport (T3) Ab Initio program.

Military Trained Pilots: The ARGUS SIC Gateway Program will approve graduates of flight training programs of the Armed Forces following evaluation of the following documentation:

- USAF: AF Form 8, Certificate of Aircrew Qualification, as well as an individual flightcrew record
- US Army: ARMY Form DA-759, Individual Flight Record and Flight Certificate-ARMY
- US Coast Guard: OPNAVFORM 3710-31, Aviators Flight Logbook (to include Instrument Qualification).
- US Navy and Marines: OPNAVFORM 3760-31, Aviators Flight Logbook (to include Instrument Qualification) and NATOPS Flight Personnel Training and Qualifications Jacket

For turbojet powered aircraft, Full Motion Simulator training and an appropriate SIC type rating in the aircraft they will fly will be required. Candidate must also meet the hourly requirements of FAR 135.4 (500 hours total time).



Aeronautical University with associated FAR Part 141 Flight School: The ARGUS SIC Gateway Program will approve graduates of an Aeronautical University listed on the website of the General Aviation and Commercial Division (AFS-800) that have completed their multi-engine commercial training (with instrument privileges) under an affiliated FAR Part 141 Training Program. This program must meet the requirements of Advisory Circular AC 61-139.

For turbojet powered aircraft, Full Motion Simulator training and an appropriate SIC type rating in the aircraft they will fly will be required. Graduates that have 60 credit hours toward an Aviation Major must also meet the hourly requirements of FAR 135.4 (500 hours total time). Graduates that have less than 60 credit hours toward an Aviation Major, but more than 30 (Associates Degree) must have 750 hours total time.

Applicants must not have any enforcement, accident or incident history.

Applicants must have at minimum 500 hours total time, 250 time as Pilot in Command.
